# 1001 Stories

### About the Project

1001 Stories is a mass-participation project that sits at the heart of Leeds' 2023 Year of Culture. A collaboration between The Performance Ensemble, Leeds Playhouse, LEEDS 2023, Leeds Museums and Galleries and Leeds Older People's Forum, the joint-project will put the voices, histories and stories of older people centre-stage by gathering 1001 stories from those aged 60 and over and creating new artistic work based on these stories. In April 2023 the project will culminate in a two-week 'takeover' of Leeds Playhouse in which this exciting new work will be presented.

# Do You Have A Story to Tell?

We believe that everybody is creative and has a story to tell, this could be anything from a funny anecdote, to a milestone memory. Your story does not have to be a long one; if it is true and means something to you, then we want to hear it.

Our aim is to present a vast range of experiences from the people of Leeds and to demonstrate that the stories of older people have cultural value - whether that is by making others laugh, think, feel or simply engage with a story that is different from their own.

Anyone over the age of 60 with a connection to Leeds is eligible to take part; whether you were born here, have previously lived or worked here, or currently call Leeds home.

## Tell Us Your Story

Submitting your story to 1001 Stories is easy! This booklet contains simple templates to help you write your story down or create an audio or video file. You can then send these to us via email, Whatsapp, post or in person by following the instructions at the bottom of each page.

## Accompany Your Story with an Image

We would love to put a face to your story! If you feel comfortable doing so, please send a picture of yourself with your story. You can attach this to your email, send it to us with your story on WhatsApp, or if you are delivering your story to us in-person you can include a hard-copy photograph (please note that we are unable to return hard-copy images).

### How to: Get it Down on Paper (or Email)

Minimum Length	There is no minimum length, short anecdotes are still stories.
Maximum Length	No more than one side of A4 please.
Spelling and Grammar	Don't worry if spelling and grammar isn't your strong point, or if English isn't your first language, this is your story and can be told in your own way.
Make Sure It's Legible	If you are using a computer to write your story, please use a standard font and a minimum font size of 11.
	If you are writing your story by hand please use plain white paper and block script (not cursive/ joined-up), and make sure that your writing can easily be read by someone who is unfamiliar with your handwriting style.
What to Write About	You can write about anything at all, we only ask that the story is your own, that it is true, authentic and accurate to your memory of the time. Please be aware that your story will be used publicly, so make sure to only write about something that you are happy to be released.
What Not to Write About	If you are writing about another person, please do not use their full name or any identifying information.

### How to: Submit an Audio File

Minimum Length	30-seconds.
Maximum Length	No more than five-minutes please.
Make Sure We Can Hear You	Record your story in a quiet place without background noise. Use your own voice - we love the diversity of Leeds' accents - but try to speak clearly and slowly.
Follow This Script	Start your audio by telling us your full name and age e.g. "My name is Jane Smith and I am sixty-five years-old, this is my story"
What to Speak About	You can speak about anything at all, we only ask that the story is your own, that it is true, authentic and accurate to your memory of the time. Please be aware that your story will be used publicly, so make sure to only write about something that you are happy to be released.
What Not to Speak About	If you are speaking about another person, please do not use their full name or any identifying information.
Recording Devices	Record via an app on your smartphone or computer, or send us a WhatsApp voice note.
File Format	We can only accept files in the following formats: .mp4, .m4v, .m4a, .mp3, .mpg or .ogg (WhatsApp).

### How to: Send a Video

Minimum Length	30-seconds.
Maximum Length	No more than five-minutes please.
Make Sure We Can Hear You	Record your story in a quiet place without background noise. Use your own voice - we love the diversity of Leeds' accents - but try to speak clearly and slowly.
Make Sure We Can See You	Try to record your video in landscape format in a well-lit place. If there are windows in your room, make sure that you're facing them rather than having them behind you as this can create unflattering shadows.

## How Will We Use Your Story?

Thank you for taking part in 1001 Stories by submitting your text, image, audio file or video (personal information) to the project. This form sets out how we (those organisations named above) would like to use your personal information and asks for your consent to do so.

#### 1001 Stories would like to use your personal information in the following ways:

#### Privately

- Hold on file: To be held on file by The Performance Ensemble for an indefinite amount of time appropriate to the nature of our work.

## Marcia Wright - Late Bloomer - #156

An arrogant young estate agent once referred to what was my little bit of treasured garden space as a "yard". Where I saw pots of flowers and shrubs and tomatoes growing in profusion he saw only the concrete on which they stood.

I didn't have a space of my own to garden in until I was forty. It wasn't much of a space, but it was vast to me. I had a lot of beginner's luck planting seeds and they all flowered. Great masses of pots of lovely blooms covering the concrete.

And then miraculously I was pregnant for the first time at the age of 42.
